The Day 1 Workshop will help understand Management Plans for World Heritage or potential World Heritage cities with a specific focus on case studies. It is an opportunity to share views and experiences related to current management issues of heritage sites.

Heritage sites are frequently vulnerable and need sustainable site management. Implementing a sustainable development model means recognizing existing controversies between conservation and tourism activities.

In this context, the City of Dubrovnik as Lead Partner and the Final Beneficiaries involved in the IPA Adriatic CBC project EX.PO AUS – “EXTension of POtentiality of Adriatic Unesco Sites” will present the current results of the project activities involving Cross-Border Sustainable Management of UNESCO Sites in the Adriatic.
